Reference is madeto your letter in which you request the record of George Baughman, who was pensioned in 1832, for service in the Pennsylvania Troops, War of the Revolution.

The data which follow are obtained from the papers on file in Revolutionary War pension claim, W.4632, based upon the military service in that war of George Baughman, the only soldier of that name or similar spelling, that is found on the Revolutionary War records of this office.

George Baughman (the name appears, also, as Bachman) was born October 14, 1755 or 1756, in Upper Saucon Township, Northampton County, Pennsylvania. The names of his parents are not shown.

While residing in said Upper Saucon Township, George Baughman enlisted in 1776, and served three months as a private in Captain John Robert's Company, Colonel Kieger's Pennsylvania Regiment: he enlisted in the summer of 1777, and served three months as a private in Captain Shores' Pennsylvania Company: he again enlisted in 1777, served three months in Captain Wagoner's Pennsylvania Company and was at the battle of Brandywine.

After the Revolution, he resided in Upper Season Township. Pennsylvania, and in Busics County, Pennsylvania, until 1785; then moved to Shearman's Valley, Cumberland County, atate not named, where he resided for about six years; thence to Washington County, Pennsylvania on Ten Mile Greek, and resided about four years; then moved to Ohio and settled in Franklin County, that state.

He was allowed pension on his application executed September 26, 1832, while a resident of Mifflin Township, Franklin County, Ohio.

George Baughman died April 13, 1834, place not shown.

The soldier married in June, 1780, or 1781, near quakertoen, Pennsylvania, Barbara. Her maiden name, date and place of her birth and names of her parents are not shown. She stated that she and her husband were reared in the same neighborhood.

Soldier's widow. Berbara, was allowed pension on her application executed September 6, 1844, at which time she was aged sighty-two years and resided in Mifflin Township, Franklin County.

The names of the following children of George and Barbara Baughman are shown: Sound, Henry, Johanneh, George, Elizabeth, Amalie and Susana. In 1844, son George Baughman was residing in Plain Township, Frankiin County, Ohio.

In 1832, Henry Broghman, a brother of the soldier, was liv-

The soldier stated that his first cousin, George Indiana, served with him in Captain Wagoner's Company in he Revolutionary for. There are no further data in regard to this George Indiana.

In order to obtain the date of last payment of pension, the name and address of person paid and possibly the date of death of the Revolutionary War pensioner, Darbers Bougham, widow of eggge Bougham (W.4632), you should address The Comptroller General, energy are accounting Office, Records Division, this chief and after the following dates
